1. A trireme had three rows of oars (00:12) (true)
2. It was better for battles in the open sea (00:27) (false- battles close to shore)
3. Thucydides claims that the Greeks took the design of the triremes from the Phoenicians (00:52) (false-Corinthians)
4. The trireme was made for short journeys (1:05) (true)
5. Triremes were decorated with eyes and other designs to make them go faster (1:34) (false-make them look menacing to their enemies)
6. One of the battle tactics was to ram the enemy ship (1:45) (true)
7. There were about 200 rowers in a trireme (1:54) (false-170)
8. The kybernetes was the captain of a trireme (2:17) (false-trierarch was the captain, the kybernetes was in charge of the deck)
9. The rowers were usually slaves (2:29) (false-free citizens)
10. The crew was trained during wartime to prepare for operating the trireme (2:40) (false-peacetime)
